




Torino, the elegant and dynamic capital of Piemonte

Italy's first capital city and today the beating heart of Piemonte, Torino has an innate creative energy. Its more than 50 museums, including the Royal Museums, the Fondazione Torino Musei (with the GAM-Gallery of Modern and Contemporary Art, MAO-Museum of Oriental Art and Palazzo Madama), and the extraordinary complex of the UNESCO-listed Residences of the Royal House of Savoy of Piemonte, are the best expression of its deep connection with art and innovation. A forerunner of international trends, it is an avant-garde stage for famous art, music and film festivals.

A UNESCO Creative City of Design since 2014, it is one of the greenest cities in Italy and Europe. Torino is also the capital of taste, the perfect international ambassador of the most authentic Piemonte. Here is where vermouth and the aperitif, gianduja chocolate and homemade ice cream were born, and here the gastronomic tradition of Piemonte is expressed with outstanding results, to be tried in the historic pastry shops and cafés, trattorias and Michelin-starred restaurants, for the sheer delight of the senses.





Welcome to Court in the Residences of the Royal House of Savoy of Piemonte

A UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1997, the elegant complex of the 16 Residences of the Royal House of Savoy of Piemonte invites you to a fascinating journey among artistic and natural treasures. Designed and embellished by leading architects and artists between the XVIII and the XVIII centuries, this "Crown of Delights" extends from the centre of Torino, right up to the Canavese and Cuneo areas. Let Torino surprise you with the Palazzo Reale, the Palazzo Chiablese and the Musei Reali, which houses Leonardo da Vinci's self-portrait and a unique group of drawings, along with Palazzo Madama, Palazzo Carignano, Castello del Valentino and Villa della Regina. Just outside the city, the splendours and rituals of court

life are revived in the grand *Reggia di Venaria* with its imposing gardens and the nearby *Castello della Mandria* immersed in 3,000 hectares of the homonymous nature park. We now move on to the *Castello di Rivoli*, which houses the first museum of contemporary art founded in Italy and then the *Palazzina di Caccia di Stupinigi* and the *Castello di Moncalieri*. In the Canavese area around Ivrea, it is possible to reach the *Castle of Agliè*, while in the province of Cuneo you will be amazed by the beauty of the *Castello di Racconigi* and its park, the *Castello di Govone* and the *Tenuta di Pollenzo*, home to the University of Gastronomic Sciences and the Wine Bank.



Contemporary Art

Piemonte's long historic passion for art began in *Torino* in 1863, with the establishment of the *GAM-Gallery of Modern* and *Contemporary Art*, the first public collection of modern art in Italy. Today Torino is recognized as the capital of contemporary art with international events such as *Artissima Fair* and *Contemporary Art Week*, as well as *Luci d'Artista*, the series of open-air installations by international artists that brighten the city's winter with light and colour. Torino is a widespread museum network, which gives a voice to a

lively atmosphere of cultural ferment, with the Fondazione Sandretto Re Rebaudengo and the Fondazione Mario Merz, the MEF - Ettore Fico Museum along with the impressive former railway workshop complex, OGR - Officine Grandi Riparazioni Ferroviarie, now a cultural and innovation hub, the Giovanni and Marella Agnelli Picture Gallery, CAMERA - Italian Centre for Photography and the new exhibition space Gallerie d'Italia. A place of exciting past and future contamination is the Castello di Rivoli, Contemporary Art

Museum: enriched by the new museum centre Cerruti Collection, it hosts an extraordinary collection of works, as well as exhibitions, workshops and extensive cultural promotion activities. Works and installations "dialogue" with the environment at both the PAV - Parco di Arte Vivente, an experimental contemporary art centre with an open-air exhibition site and interactive museum, and at the MAU - Museum of Urban Art. Following an ideal art mapping itinerary, the territory reveals an unprecedented repertoire of installations and works of art scattered among vineyards, villages and hills, especially in the Langhe, Roero and Monferrato in Asti and Alessandria area. There are also many public and private foundations that open an extremely rich cultural heritage to the public, from the historical avant-garde to contemporary contributions. Between Asti and Torino, the Castello di Rivara hosts exhibitions, is an artist's residence and home to the Museo d'Arte Italiana, with works from the 1980s to date.



Torino and Piemonte in the spotlight

Italian cinema has deep roots in Piemonte, and Torino was the first capital in 1896, when the Lumière brothers set up the first projection in Italy in the city. The first studios and cinemas were born here; this is the city $that \, launched \, in ternationally \, renowned \, producers. \, To rino$ is a unique urban set that recounts important chapters in the history of cinema in the numerous locations scattered throughout its neighbourhoods. Today it promotes and hosts prestigious festivals for spectators of all ages, such as the TFF - Torino Film Festival, Torino LGBTQI, CinemAmbiente and Sottodiciotto Film Festival, as well as the multimedia ViewFest. The temple of the seventh art is the Mole Antonelliana, home to the National Museum of Cinema with an extraordinary collection of 1,800,000 works, including films, archival documents, photographs, apparatus and art objects, posters and memorabilia. But the protagonist of the big screen is also the entire region, playing an increasingly central role in Italian and international film and television productions. From Lake Maggiore to Lake Orta, from the hills of Langhe-Roero and Monferrato to the UNESCOlisted Residences of the Royal House of Savoy, Piemonte is an appealing destination for film tourism enthusiasts, but also a source of ideas and talents, as demonstrated by the Film Commission Torino Piemonte, one of the most active and creative realities at a national level.

In 1806, in the Italian capital of chocolate, Torino, the delicious Gianduiotto was born, a sweet symbol that wins over everyone's palate.

The *Banca del Vino di Pollenzo* in the Langhe hosts *100,000 bottles* of the best Italian wine production, an unmissable oenological jewel.

Over 61 varieties of cheese and 180 types of bread can be tasted in Piemonte, a true gastronomic paradise for food aficionados.

Alba, a UNESCO Creative City for Gastronomy and the 44 Michelin-starred restaurants offer a world-class culinary experience.

A journey through flavours

A favourite destination for gourmets in every season, Piemonte offers authentic multi-sensorial experiences based on an ancient artisan knowledge and the high quality of the products: chocolate, PGI hazelnuts, excellent *meats* and varieties of *rice* grown between Vercelli, Novara and Biella, as well as delicious artisan cheeses. The true gastronomic star is the White Truffle of Alba, which can transform a steaming risotto or a plate of raw meat into an ecstasy for the palate. The main role is undoubtedly claimed by wine, with 18 DOCG and 41 DOC labels, many of which are produced in the Vineyard Landscapes of Langhe-Roero and Monferrato, a UNESCO world heritage site since 2014. With its versatile land, Piemonte is synonymous with high-ranking wines such as the reds Barolo, Barbaresco, Nebbiolo, Dolcetto, Barbera, Ghemme, Gattinara and Brachetto d'Acqui, along with the whites Roero Arneis, Erbaluce, Gavi, Alta Langa and Asti Spumante. There is also the highly prestigious traditional production of craft beers and excellent liqueurs such as grappa. And on the Wine, Cheese and Honey Roads, through villages, castles and wineries, Piemonte will reveal its most authentic soul, made up of people, stories and a love for the land. It is the home of Slow Food, the international movement that began in Bra (Cuneo) in 1986 to promote and protect "good, clean

and fair" food.

In 1986, *Slow Food* originated in Bra. The most extensive rice fields in Europe can be found in Piemonte, testifying to the wealth and gastronomic quality of the region.

Outdoor Experiences

The natural environments of Piemonte are a mosaic of colours and diversity to be discovered at a slow pace, from the "checkered sea" of rice fields located between Biella, Novara and Vercelli, to the lakes, from the hills to the peaks of the Alps and Apennines. If *trekking*, *horse riding*, *mountaineering* or *rowing* are among your passions, preferably in contact with well-preserved nature, then you will be at home in Piemonte. If the motorbike is your irreplaceable travel and adventure companion, pleasant rides await you among the hills and vineyards of the Langhe or in Monferrato Astigiano and Alessandria, with strategic stops dedicated to the palate. *Cycle touring*, *mountain biking* or *slow biking*? The opportuni-

ties multiply to enjoy enthralling experiences among ancient villages and amazingly beautiful panoramas. On the *Historic Mountain Roads* you set out to discover military, ancient trade, emigration and spiritual routes. And on the ancient *Via del Sale* (Salt Route), *Vélo-Viso Cycle Routes between Piemonte and Liguria*, the Cuneo area will no longer hold any secrets. You can test yourself at altitude by *sailing* or *windsurfing* on the Alpine lakes. If sport is synonymous with adrenaline for you, then you can enjoy the area from aboard a hot-air balloon or *helicopter*, or go *hang-gliding* and *paragliding*... In Piemonte nothing is impossible!


Piemonte is home to Italian cycling. Over **20,000** km of cycling and hiking routes to freely enjoy nature.




Not only skiing: **snowshoeing**, **ski mountaineering**, **icefalls** for great moments of fun and adventure.

In 2006, Turin hosted the *XX Olympic Winter Games*, an event that brought together athletes from around the world in an unforgettable sporting celebration.

Over 450 km of cross-country skiing trails, a paradise for sports enthusiasts immersed in beautiful unspoilt nature.

1,350 km of beautiful slopes in over 50 ski resorts, 300 ski lifts and 14 snow parks for memorable days on the snow. Choose your holiday with family and friends, in the warm hospitality of ultra-modern hotels and wellequipped mountain huts. Mountain and nature lovers, but also those who prefer to enjoy the snow with excursions and typical food and wine, will feel at home in Piemonte. After a day of sport, relaxation and fun with a view of the spectacular Alpine peaks are just what is needed. Be inspired by winter in the Torino Alps: enjoy the Vialattea, with 400 km of slopes connecting Sestriere, Sauze d'Oulx, Oulx, San Sicario, Cesana Torinese, Claviere, and the French resort of Montgenèvre. Bardonecchia Ski attracts enthusiasts with 100 km of slopes for skiing and snowboarding. In the Cuneo Alps, Riserva Bianca offers more than 80 km of slopes and

trails, and fun parks for the little ones, while in the vast Mondolé Ski area, with a single 'hands-free' ski pass, you can ski on over 130 km of downhill slopes and one cross-country trail. In the Neveazzurra ski resort, in the Lake Maggiore area, in Macugnaga and Domobianca (20 km of slopes), you can ski with panoramic views along the slopes of *Mottarone*, between *Lake Maggiore* and Lake Orta. In Valsesia, Monterosa Ski is a unique ski area with more than 180 km of slopes connecting Piemonte and Valle d'Aosta. In the shadow of Monte Rosa, Alagna Freeride Paradise is a wonderful surprise combining nature and the thrills of high-altitude sport. In Bielmonte, in the Oasi Zegna Nature Park near Biella, an authentic snowy paradise awaits snow experts and aspiring champions with 20 km of downhill slopes and 20 km for cross-country skiing.

Itineraries of Art and Spirituality

Re-interpreting Piemonte's cultural and spiritual history through the places that were protagonists, the extraordinary heritage of a land of art. This is an experience that requires a slow pace along a vast network of paths, to travel on foot, by bicycle or even on horseback, passing fortified areas and churches, abbeys and fortresses. The rare beauty of religious and secular architecture, small mostly intact villages, parish churches and cathedrals: there are countless treasures of *Romanesque art* dotting the territory, in particular the Abbazia di Santa Maria di Vezzolano, in the Monferrato Astigiano area, and the magnificent Romanesque-Gothic style Abbey complex of Santa Maria di Staf-

farda, in Revello (Cuneo). The Valle di Susa stretch of the Via Francigena is full of enchanting surprises, with the imposing Sacra di San Michele and the Abbazia di Novalesa, while in Vercelli the Cathedral, the Museum of the Cathedral Treasure and the Basilica of Sant'Andrea recount the multi-millennial local history and the connections between Piemonte and Europe. In Novara, the imposing dome dominates the Basilica di San Gaudenzio, the architectural symbol of the city. With works such as the Cappella della Sindone (Holy Shroud), Torino's harmonious Baroque shapes and colours prevail. In the Cuneo area, the Basilica Regina Montis Regalis, one of Piemonte's most important

Baroque masterpieces, amazes visitors with the largest and entirely frescoed elliptical dome in the world. Built between the XV and XVII centuries in beautiful natural settings, adorned with statues and frescoes, the UNESCO-listed 7 Sacri Monti (Sacred Mounts) are also architectural and artistic wonders: the Sacro Monte di Varallo, in the province of Vercelli, the Sacro Monte di Orta, in the Novara area, the Sacro Monte di Crea (Serralunga di Crea, Alessandria); the Sacro Monte di Oropa (Biella), the Sacro Monte di Belmonte (Torino), the Sacro Monte di Ghiffa and the Sacro Monte di Domodossola, in the Verbano-Cusio-Ossola province. A crossroads of stories and people, Piemonte preserves



some of the most important Jewish art heritage in Italy, such as the synagogues of Torino, Vercelli and Casale Monferrato, with its *Museo dei Lumi* (The Museum of Lights) with a valuable collection of lights made by contemporary artists for the ritual festival of Hanukkah. On the *Via Alta dei Walser* in Valsesia, rediscover the religious art and traditions of this population that settled in Piedmont in the Early Middle Ages, while a short distance from Torino, several itineraries on foot or by bicycle will lead you to the green *Waldesian Valleys* in the Pinerolo area.

The *Sanctuary of Vicoforte* is crowned by the largest *elliptical dome* in the world, with $6000 \ m^2$ of frescoes. It is an unparalleled artistic spectacle.







Nestling in an enchanting natural setting, *Lake Maggiore*, *Lake Mergozzo* and *Lake Orta* are among the most popular destinations in the world for their mild microclimate, historic villas surrounded by beautiful parks and international events. All around, the *Ossola Valleys* present forests and alpine lakes, relaxing spas and genuine flavours. *Monte Rosa*, the *Toce Waterfall*, the *Val Grande National Park*, *Veglia Devero* and *Alta Valle Antrona Nature Parks* are coveted places for those seeking authentic environments.

Isola di San Giulio is dominated by the majestic Romanesque Basilica and the Benedictine abbey, making the island a realm of peace and beauty.

The *Colossus of San Carlo* is famous as the *second tallest bronze statue in the world*, a majestic work dominating the horizon with its grandeur.


